THE PRIME MINISTER OF AUSTRALIA VISITED UNIVERSITAS HASANUDDIN



Australian Prime Minister, Anthony Albanese, paid a visit to Makassar City on Tuesday (7/6) together with his retinue, including the Australian Minister of Foreign Affairs (Mrs. Penny Hong), Australian Minister of Trade and Tourism (Don Farrel), Australian Minister of Industry and Science (Ed Husic), Federal Member of Solomon (Luke Gosling), and Australian Ambassador to Indonesia (Penny Williams) also attended Prime Minister Albanese's visit.

PM Albanese and his entourage were warmly welcomed directly by Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc, as the Rector of Unhas, along with other leaders of Unhas.

The Rector of Unhas emphasized that the relationship between Indonesia, especially Makassar, and Australia has a long history, which can be traced back more than 200 years ago.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Albanese in his reply speech said that the historical connection of trade between Makassar residents and indigenous Australians. The visit of Australian Prime Minister Albanese to Makassar is a historic moment because this is the first time the Supreme leader of Australia visiting this city.

The visit to discuss collaboration in various fields took place starting at 01.30 pm WITA offline in the Academic Senate Room, 2nd Floor of the Rectorate Building, Tamalanrea Campus, Makassar, Thursday (09/06).

Also, the speakers presenting were Prof. Pat Wheeler (Head of Power Electronics, Machines and Control Research Group, Faculty of Engineering), Dr. Bagus Muljadi (UKICIS Coordinator), Dr. Louise Walker (Associate Professor Midwifery, Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences), David Ouchterlonie (Associate Director Global Engagement) and Shannon Baverstock (Senior Global Engagement Manager).

"I hope Unhas can be involved in the UK-Indonesia Consortium for Interdisciplinary Sciences or UKICIS consortium program, which is a funding program to support collaborative research between Indonesian and British researchers in the green economy, blue economy, and so on," said Prof. JJ.

On the same occasion, representing the University of Nottingham as well as the UKICIS Coordinator, Dr. Bagus

expressed his gratitude for the extraordinary welcome from Unhas. He gave a general explanation about Nottingham as well as related to the UKICIS program which was formed at the initiative of the Directorate General of Education, Research and Technology in collaboration with the Education Fund Management Institute and other parties.

Bagus said UKICIS is a funding opportunity for universities in Indonesia who wish to conduct research with academics from the United Kingdom. UKICIS is a consortium program of universities in the UK and Indonesia that aims to accelerate technology transfer through collaborative research.

Deputy Chairman of the People's Consultative Assembly of the Republic of Indonesia, Dr. Sjarifuddin Hasan, in his speech, said that the government continuously provides support for collaborative efforts in producing quality human resources. Various collaborative programs carried out by universities are strategic steps that need to be optimized.

After giving a speech, it was continued with a discussion about opportunities for cooperation through the UKICIS program.

The activity took place virtually through the zoom meeting application at 04.00 pm WITA, Friday (10/6).

The rector of Universitas Hasanuddin, Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., in his introduction said that Unhas continues to open up opportunities for collaborative education with university partners abroad. This time, the destination country for Unhas cooperation is a South Asian country, namely India.

“This meeting is an effort of Unhas in increasing the cooperation that has been established with several international universities. Unhas continues to raise the level of quality of education through the reputation of the university by providing services and access to international education to lecturers and students in carrying out the Tridharma of higher education,” explained Prof. JJ.

So far, there are 5 universities from India that have collaborated within the framework of Academic

Peer with three faculties (FIKP, Medicine, and Pharmacy), Unhas, namely:

1. Narayana Netralaya Eye Institute – Faculty of Medicine, Unhas
2. Columbia College of Pharmacy – Faculty of Pharmacy, Unhas
3. National Institute of Technology Agartala – Faculty of Marine and Fisheries Sciences, Unhas (FIKP)
4. University of Calcutta – Faculty of Marine and Fisheries Sciences, Unhas
5. Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology – Faculty of Marine and Fisheries Sciences, Unhas

On the same occasion, Atdikbud of the Indonesian Embassy in New Delhi, Dr. Aldrin Herwany, said India is the right country to collaborate with Unhas, as evidenced by five universities that have opened and strengthened educational cooperation opportunities.

Aldrin hopes that this exploration of cooperation can be realized soon based on the results of joint discussions to expand educational cooperation with Indian universities.

MUN (Model United Nations) Community of Universitas Hasanuddin Hosted the Y20 Satellite under the theme "Optimizing Benefits and Managing Risks of the Digital Transformation for Youth". The official opening took place at A.P Pettarani Main Hall at 09.00 WIT on Wednesday (15/06).

Youth 20 (Y20) is a leadership forum that brings together future young leaders and professionals from all G20 member countries to generate ideas and solutions to the current global challenges. The future leaders from all G20 member countries were expected to discuss, argue, and exchange ideas regarding the agenda of the G20 Presidency. Y20 Summit was held in Jakarta, Indonesia, in July 2022 and Indonesian Youth Diplomacy (IYD) was chosen to be the official event organizer for the Summit. Y20 Satellite opens up a forum for discussion on digital acceleration and digital transformation for youth.

On the same occasion, the Governor of South Sulawesi in written remarks read by the Head of the Information Communication and Coding Office (Amson Padolo, S.Sos, M.Si.), stated that the millennial generation has always had to adapt to digital transformation. The role of youth requires an attitude of maturity in facing inevitable social changes. The big challenge today is the rapid advancement of technology, so it needs to be strengthened with digital literacy. Hopefully, the younger generation will

be able to maintain their attitude and improve their communication and speaking skills in conveying arguments and aspirations to the public and most importantly in equipping themselves with awareness of international issues.

The event was officially opened by the Rector of Hasanuddin University, Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc. In his remarks, Prof. JJ said that the Y20 Satellite is a momentum for Indonesian youth to contribute and voice critical thinking to bring Indonesia's name in line with other nations and admired by the world, and provide opportunities for the younger generation to take a role in world leadership.

Youth should encourage each other because everything can be done together. After the official opening, the activity then continued with a discussion with the speakers, namely Biondi Sanda Sima (Track Chair for Digital Transformation of Y20 Indonesia 2022), and Michael Sianipar (Co-Chair of Y20 Indonesia 2022) guided by Nurul Habaib Al Mukarramah (Research Intern at T20) as the moderator.

The rector of Universitas Hasanuddin (Unhas), Prof. Dr. Ir. Jamaluddin Jompa, M.Sc., warmly welcomed the team of Marine Technology Cooperation Research Center (MTCRC) led by Hansan Park as the Director. The event was conducted at Rector Meeting Room, Rectorate building level 8th, Tamalanrea Campus, at 14.30 WITA on Wednesday (15/06). MTCRC team members who attended the meeting were Mr. Shin Suk Kyung (Project Supervisor from KOHA, South Korea), Dr. Choi Jong Kook (Project Manager from KIOST), Ivonne Milichristi Radjawane, and Safri Burhanuddin (Chairman of the MTCRC Advisory Board).

To begin with, Safri Burhanuddin explained the purpose of the MTCRC team's visit to Unhas was to explore partnerships with the Korea-Indonesia MTCRC program, with the main issue of marine and fisheries. The form of collaboration can be done through training for students in the use of oceanographic tools. On the same occasion, Hansan Park presented an overview of Korea-Indonesia Collaboration through the MTCRC which focuses on marine science and technology. The program has been establishing various activities such as joining

research projects and capacity building that put forward a sustainable principle for the next generation mainly in the Maritime sector.

The activity took place offline, limited to the Prof. Hall Building, dr. Hardjoeno, Graduate School, Unhas, Unhas Tamalanrea Campus, Thursday (9/6).

This seminar presented two speakers, namely: Professor Pat Wheeler (Head of Power Electronics Machines and Control Research Group, Faculty of Engineering), and Dr. Bagus Muljadi, Assistant Professor of Chemical and Environmental Engineering, Faculty of Engineering UK, Indonesia Consortium for Interdisciplinary Sciences (UKICIS) Coordinator).

The event began with a speech by the Head of SDGs Center Unhas, Dr. Muhammad Yusri Zamhuri. He said that the implementation of this seminar was aimed to provide an understanding of the effects of air pollution due to vehicle activities that have an impact on climate change.

"The resource persons we present are experts in their fields, who will provide an overview and understanding regarding the topic of our discussion. We hope to be a part of playing an important role in overcoming the challenges of climate change," explained Dr. Yusri.

In his presentation, Professor Pat Wheeler explained the role of new and renewable energy in responding to the challenges of controlling climate change. It was explained that the energy transition of the transportation sector is important in increasing the efficiency of reducing carbon emissions.

Furthermore, Professor Pat Wheeler explained the realization of investment in renewable technology for future use by developing an ecosystem for using electrified vehicles as an energy efficiency measure.

The activity was then continued with a presentation by Dr. Bagus Muljadi, and continued with a discussion, question, and answer session which was attended by approximately 100 participants.

Prof. Farid Dahdouh is a professor and a Head of the Systems Ecology and Resource Management (SERM) research unit. In his presentation, Prof. Farid discussed about the material provided an overview of the history, development, and use of remote sensing technology in the environment and forestry sector, one of which is to detect the area or conservation of the Mangrove Socio-Ecological System.

FACULTY OF FORESTRY UNHAS HELD PUBLIC LECTURE BY AUSTRALIAN RESOURCE PERSON

The Faculty of Forestry, UNHAS held a public lecture entitled “On-Line Bird Series - 2” with the topic “How Do We Plan for Species Conservation Considering Climate Change? A Case Study of Cockatoos”. This activity is conducted virtually and presented Dr. April as a Lecture in Wildlife Science, School of Agricultural & Food Sciences, The University of Queensland.

Dr. April is a biologist and researcher, who focuses on conservation planning. In this regard, on this occasion, Dr. April Resid explained several important points related to conservation or efforts to protect species by implementing climate change adaptation strategies, namely the protection of Gang-Gang Cockatoo (*Callocephalon fimbriatum*) and glossy black cockatoo (*Calyptorhynchus lathami*).

Dr. April also explained that the University of Queensland has developed a management plan that provides detailed management recommendations for Cockatoo conservation against climate change scenarios in determining the future of the habitat or species to have a longer period.

This development is supported by the Australian Capital Territory (ACT) Government. The ACT joins other cities, states, and territories around the world in declaring a climate emergency, recognizing the need for urgent action at all levels, and government levels in order to securing the future and for all species and future generations.

AIHSP is an initiative that takes place in four provinces, namely: Yogyakarta, Central Java, Bali, and South Sulawesi. In South Sulawesi, there are five focus districts namely; Maros, Gowa, Bone, Enrekang, and Pinrang.
